CANADA-U.S. IPG ATTENDS 2016 FALL MEETING OF THE CAN/AM BORDER TRADE ALLIANCE

The BTA is a coalition of businesses, public-sector organizations and individuals with an interest in bilateral trade and tourism. Its mission is to maximize commercial activity and ensure continued growth in cross-border trade, as well as efficient and productive border-crossing capabilities.
