Canada-U.S. Inter-Parliamentary Group to Meet with Governors and Members of Congress

Senator Wilfred Moore (Stanhope St/South Shore, Nova Scotia) Acting Co-Chair of the Canada-United States Inter-Parliamentary Group will lead a delegation that will meet with Governors during the Winter Meeting of the National Governors Association (NGA) taking place in Washington, D.C., February 20-22, 2010.

On February 23 and 24, the delegation will take advantage of their presence in Washington by meeting with Congressional colleagues on key issues including the need for a smoothly functioning shared border, and trade irritants such as "Buy America" provisions and country of origin labeling (COOL).

Senator Wilfred Moore and members of the delegation will hold a <u>media</u> <u>availability on Thursday, February 25, 2010, at 10 a.m.</u> It will take place in the media center of the Embassy of Canada in Washington, D.C.
